

- b. Comma (,) indicates the short pause, e.g. Amar, I hope you will come.
- c. Question Mark (?) is used after a question, e.g. What is your name?
- d. Exclamation Mark (!) is used to express strong emotion or sudden feeling, e.g. What a good advice!

A pronoun is a word that is used in the place of a noun, e.g.: he, she, it, his, her etc.


